NATIONAL BROADCASTING COMMISSION GRANTS BINGHAM UNIVERSITY CAMPUS RADIO LICENCE

The National Broadcasting Commission (NBC) has approved the Bingham University Campus Radio. The Director General, Mr. Ishaq Kawu Modibbo, while handing over the licence to the Ag. Vice-Chancellor, Prof. William B. Qurix, OFR, congratulated the university for scaling through the rigorous process. He stated that the rule and code of ethics guiding broadcasting must be adhered to, as any deviation could lead to withdrawal of the licence. He pointed out that broadcasting is a serious business and any information going out must be accurate. **"Disinformation can result in a negative impact on the community and the society at large"**, he added.

Responding on behalf of the Management, Prof. Qurix, expressed gratitude to the Management of NBC for granting Bingham University the licence to run a radio station. He assured the Director General of the university's readiness to run the campus radio according to the rules.

He applauded the ministry on the strides it was making on recovery of illicit funds from abroad, boko haram, herdsmen and order crime related issues facing the country.

Responding on behalf of the Minister of Justice, Mr. Dayo Apata, Esq the Solicitor-General/Permanent Secretary Ministry of Justice, welcomed the Ag. Vice Chancellor and the Management team of the university to the Ministry. He said the ministry was committed to being socially responsible to the community with its resources in order to influence the community positively towards nation building. He said that **"any investment in education is never wasted"**. He added that Bingham University was a household name in Abuja and environs and assured the management of the university of its open doors in terms of partnership in research and the overall development of legal education.

BINGHAM UNIVERSITY HOLDS TRAINING WORKSHOP FOR NEW SECURITY STAFF

Bingham University recently organized a three day training workshop for the newly recruited members of staff in the Security Department.

Speaking on the topic **"Role of security guards in ensuring a safe learning environment in Bingham University"**, the Ag. Dean, Faculty of Law, Dr. Mrs. Salome Konkat Kigbu stated that a university is a place where learning takes place to prepare future leaders. She added that **"security is an act of protecting life, property, information, materials, goods and services in a given area"**. A security guard should always be punctual, skilled, experienced, good in communicating and sharp. Dr. Mrs. Kigbu challenged the new guards to ensure that the premises and the properties of the university were effectively protected. She said **"you are to control access into and out of the university, including monitoring entrances and gate passage, inspecting bags and vehicles"**.

On his part, Mr. Francis Haruna said that security is the protection of life, property and interests. He implored the new members of staff to be loyal, observant, calm under pressure and possess good interpersonal and communication skills. Mr Haruna said **"surveillance reduces the tendencies for threats and helps security personnel to systematically study potential targets with the aim of collecting information that will be analyzed or processed to produce intelligence"**.

Also speaking at the training session, Mr. Andy Agaldo stated that access control allows movement of authorized personnel or material in and out of the facility while detecting, delaying and denying access of unauthorized persons. He added that **"entry control elements may be found at facility boundaries such as vehicle access, building entry points or doors into rooms or other special areas within a building"**. Mr. Agaldo added that permission for entry and exit and provision of information that enables security access and response, form the core objective of access control.

“WHEN YOU PILE YOUR WORK, YOU HAVE STARTED FAILING”

The Deputy Vice-Chancellor, Prof Alexander Babatunde Adelaiye made the statement while welcoming new, returning students, and members of staff to the new academic session. He challenged the new students not to be procrastinators. He said *“ensure that your hard work commences from day one and all activities slated for each day are completed before you sleep, because when you pile your work, you have started failing”*. Prof. Adelaiye stated that Bingham University seeks to produce Christian graduates that will be agents of change in the society. He added that *“The way of the lord, which we are trying to teach you, is the best, there is no alternative to it. Our joy is to see you outshine us in your chosen fields”*

Professor Adelaiye charged the returning students to be good example to the new students. He said, *“be a good example to the new students in your conduct, character, and in your attitude towards everything as a student of Bingham University”*. He challenged all students to comport themselves and be of good behaviour as the students disciplinary committee will not hesitate to sanction any student that violates the rules and regulations of the school.

Professor Adelaiye also urged members of staff to be good examples to the students. He stated that *“you are meant to train students to be good members of the society; therefore you must set the pace by being good examples to them in your character and conduct”*. He added that the university will not hesitate to sanction any staff that breaches the principles and rules guiding the institution.

EXTRACTIVES HUB SEEKS COLLABORATION WITH BINGHAM UNIVERSITY

The Management of the Extractives Hub is seeking collaboration with Bingham University. This was made known when Mr. Jide Amosaiye and Miss Clinenye Okechukwu, both representatives of Extractives Hub, paid the Vice Chancellor a visit in his office.

The Extractives Hub is an online platform designed to support government officials, policy makers, students, amongst others who are decision makers on the planning and management of Nigeria's natural resources. The Hub also contains a fully searchable library of the latest reports, legislation and analyses of the extractives sector governance.

The Vice Chancellor, Prof. W. B. Qurix, in his remarks, welcomed the team and assured them of the university's willingness to partner with the Extractives Hub. Prof. Qurix stated that all appropriate actions on the university's part would be taken to consummate the partnership.

The Extractives Hub is a partner of the Nigerian Extractives Industry Transparency Initiative (NEITI), an agency of the Federal Government of Nigeria.

Applications are invited from qualified candidates for admission into the University's Remedial and IJMB (A' Level) Programme for the 2018/2019 academic session.

Candidates will be admitted into the Degree programmes on successful completion of their programme.

ENTRY REQUIREMENTS INTO REMEDIAL AND IJMB (A' LEVEL)

PRE-DEGREE: Candidates applying into this programme should possess a minimum of three (3) credits at not more than two sittings in SSCE, NECO, NBTE or GCE in relevant subjects. However, candidates with deficiencies in the O/L or 2018 UTME will have an opportunity to remedy the deficiency while on the programme. Duration for this programme is nine (9) months.

IJMB: Candidates applying into this programme should possess a minimum of five (5) credits at not more than two sittings in SSCE, NECO, NBTE or GCE in relevant subject areas. However, candidates with deficiencies in Mathematics and English Language must register for the O/L IJMB Mathematics and English Language. Duration for this programme is twelve (12) months of intensive lectures.
