Bingham University located in Karu, 25 kilometres from the Federal Capital city of Nigeria Abuja, was established in 2005 by the Evangelical Church Winning All (ECWA) as a Conventional University. It is one of the six private universities in the north and the only one established by a Christian organisation.

The main purpose of ECWA was to meet the daring need for high quality Secular Education which recognises and integrates the moral and spiritual values on which the Christian faith is founded as well as focuses on entrepreneurial studies in order to promote self-reliance among graduates of the University.

The University has its vision as follows: To become a world class University in knowledge and skills while inculcating moral and spiritual values on which the Christian faith is founded.

Mission: the mission is to produce graduates that are excellent in knowledge, character and skills for self-reliance and in the fear of Christ.

Goals: the goals among others include; to provide an all-round education to all strata of men and women in an affordable manner; to provide entrepreneurial education for innovation and creativity to all students.

Objectives: It has among its objectives to establish collaborations with national and international organisations for the purpose of research, technological advancement and staff/students exchange programmes.

Master's Degree

A study for the Master's degree shall be pursued either by:

- a. Comprehensive course work to be examined in written papers together with original research work to be presented in a project report. The credit units assigned to the project report shall not exceed one-third of the total credit units for the programme, or
- b. Course work to be examined in written papers together with original research work to be presented in dissertation. The credit units assigned to the dissertation shall neither be less than half nor greater than two third of the total credit units for the programme.

Zankli Research Centre, Bingham University

The Zankli Research Centre is a world class research centre involved in tuberculosis research. The research centre provides clinical diagnostic testing for patients suspected to have tuberculosis and bacteremia, including typhoid fever. The centre also avails its laboratory to postgraduate students for research.

Available Scholarships:

- A. 10% discount for all ECWA students
- B. 20% discount for children of ECWA Pastors to a maximum of four children
- C. 30% rebate for children of ECWA Executive members while in office
- D. ECWA indigent students' scholarship attracts a 45% discount for total fees payable and covers the duration of study provided the candidate maintains a Cumulative Grade Point Average (CGPA) of 2.5

The scholarship scheme covers all courses except Medicine.

Collaborations

At the moment, the University has the following collaborations:

- (i) Liverpool School of Tropical Medicine: The school collaborates with the University through the Zankli Research Centre; and is currently funding some of the research programmes
- (ii) MOU between Bingham University, Nigeria and Galilee International Management Institute, Israel (not active though) (2014)
- (iii) MOU with institute of Human Virology Abuja (2014)
- (iv) MOU with University of Nebraska Medical Center (UNMC) to share medical knowledge, practical and research initiatives (2013)
- (v) An MOU with Sumy State University (SSU) Ukraine (just signed)

On-going Researches which require funding

- (1) Studies on the prevalence of typhoid fever among low income earners in the urban slum of Karu Nassarawa State – (study is at its infancy)

Amount required \$250,000 over a period of one year.

- (2) Evaluating the toxicity and anti-pains property of sample A, in Rodents: To develop a safe and potent phytomedicine for management of pains

Amount required \$75,000 over six months
Researchers; Dr. Modupe Builders, Dr. Philomena Ogbone
- (3) A study of social deviant habits among motorcycle riders in Karu, Nassarawa State: An attempt at building social cohesive structures for peace and religious tolerance.

Amount required \$25,000
Researchers; Prof. Dul Johnson, Dr. John Aidokun

Other areas of collaboration to be explored:

- (i) Faculty staff exchange between Universities for short term periods to improve capacity as well as expose staff to contemporary methodologies
- (ii) Postgraduate students Bench work in specific areas for specified periods
